THREE EXCITING PROJECTS!

- In September, the vestry voted to use excess funds in the BCP account to pay for an air purification system to be installed in the a/c units of the parish hall. It is the same system as we installed in the church last year: bipolar ionization. It actively kills bacteria and viruses in the air. It was installed in October.
- 2) At it's meeting on Sunday, the vestry approved a Memorial Garden plan submitted by a landscape architect. We are ordering a 96 niche columbarium, which is being paid for by a generous donation of \$75,000 by a church member. The plans are being paid for by the donation of another member and money in the memorial fund will be used on the garden itself. The Memorial Garden will be located behind the chapel. The shed will be moved and some of the jungle by the street will be cleared. You can see the plans that were submitted on the bulletin board in the parish hall hallway. We chose plan D.
- 3) A portion of a generous \$20,000 gift will be used to upgrade the sound and video systems in the church. Blues Angel Music has been chosen by the vestry to do the work. An upgraded sound board will be put in the same room as the video equipment which will allow the sound team to make adjustments during worship, a wedding or a concert. A new PTZ camera will also be installed. It will allow us to zoom in on different parts of the church, such as the pulpit, altar or lectern. The upgrades will give us a much better live -stream for those watching at home and much better sound quality when we need a recording of a concert or wedding.

SOMETHING NEW

Starting this month, we will have something new in our newsletter. Each month under "Welcome" we will list those individuals who have joined our church family during the month along with a brief background. Each month we will also have a "Farewell" heading for those people who have moved away along with any contact information that we have for their new homes
