Fr. Gary's Name Submitted for Bishop

Yes, it is true. I have allowed my name to be submitted to the nominating committee to be considered for Bishop of our diocese. This was a difficult decision. It is one that I wrestled and prayed over for weeks. One Monday morning in prayer, I finally had peace to go forward. It is not a position I've ever sought or wanted. But for some reason, I felt the Lord clearly saying to allow my name to go in.

Let me be clear, I believe it will take a miracle for me to be elected. Yes, I've been in this diocese for almost 30 years and therefore I'm well known by those who have been here also. At the same time, many of the new clergy are not known to me. In addition, in a diocese our size, a rector of a large church is usually elected.

Timeline: the nominations are closed. Over the next few months they will interview all the candidates. Then they will narrow the list to about 5 candidates. Those candidates will be interviewed in-person in much greater depth than the initial interviews. From that list, 2-3 names will be submitted to the electing Synod in May. The person selected will be consecrated on August 27, 2022.

If I'm not elected, then you're stuck with me!

Update on the St Francis Youth

The Youth have participated in events at the church such as the Fall Festival and a few have helped Fr. Gary with some much needed maintenance around the church. We have had a lot of good times the last two years and it's all been "Fellowship". Most importantly, we have also spent time in devotionals and learning about our Heavenly Father.

While dealing with the challenges of the pandemic, several youths, and some of our leaders, have not always been able to participate. With the exception of about three months when we didn't meet at all, we met regularly, even when only a few could participate. We have had a great group of young people participating in our youth group for the past two years. I know that the youth and the leaders have thoroughly enjoyed the youth group program that we have built at St. Francis. The last two years have been a big success.

It has been a true pleasure for myself and the other leaders to have been involved with this great group of young people. It has been especially fulfilling to have gotten to know each one of them as a unique child of God. The youth group includes children and grandchildren of church members and a few of their friends. Getting to know each of them, sharing fellowship, and sharing our faith together has been a highlight of my life. I am so proud of them all have so much hope for their futures. I know the other leaders would say the same.

The success of our youth group to nurture these young people has only been made possible in large part because of the generosity of you, our St. Francis members. We have so many to sincerely Thank. I have only recently been made aware of specific gifts, and I may still not know of everyone's involvement, but I know several members have been very generous in their giving of prayers and financial support.
